

Every single dollar helps toward having a permanent home for our present seniors and our future seniors. Not only can we use money but we also need volunteers to help with the work being done in the kitchen. Anyone with experience in laying tile, putting in cabinets, putting in hanging ceilings or any kind of carpentry experience we need you! ### Minutes:

June Ervin made the motion to accept the minutes as printed. Will Hooper second the motion. Motion carried.

### Treasurer's Report:

Val Ashcraft made the motion to accept the minutes. Margaret Roark second the motion. Motion carried

### Building Committee:

June Ervin brought up the need for Pest Control. There are gaps between the walls and the floors and under entrance doors. Linda Sheridan has someone who is going to come and give the Center a bid.  
The kitchen is waiting for walls to be finished and the drop ceiling to be installed. Brook from the bank informed Linda S. that he is holding invoices for the elevator, property taxes and RUSA. We have a new property manager, Jessica Schan. She lives in the neighborhood and is very interested in supporting the Senior Center.

### Policy & Procedures:

The computer in the office is not protected. If you want to use it or keep something on the computer for future use, keep it on a flash drive. We need to have the computer set up to defrag and scan disc for the last day of the month or once a week. Need to check on Norton Anti-Virus and Malware.

### Membership:

Per Linda S. there were 60 payments made during the month of March. Per Val there were 398 tour group flyers mailed this last time.  
There is a need to have someone sit at the front door and greet people as they come in. We need to get them to sign in and if not a member give them the opportunity to join. We need someone for afternoons.

### Tour Group:

Ashland Outdoor Theater is shut down until July. There is a trip set up for the Oregon Gardens in Silverton. They have a dining area and a snack bar. Trip is scheduled for May 21st.  
In June there is a glass covered boat trip for over the bar or up the river, depending on the weather. Lunch will be at noon and it is a 2 hour trip. We need 58 people to do the trip. Winston has the same information.

#### Rules of Operation

Trip sheets will be sent out one trip to a sheet.

Do not call to be put on the list, you will be put on the list when we receive your check.

Send a separate check for each trip.

When sending in your check, please include your phone number, your seating partner if you have one, where you will be getting on the bus and any special requirements such as: bringing a walker or wheelchair or any other special requests.

We are requesting an emergency contact number be included with your check.

Bus seating is assigned according to the date that we receive your checks, taking into account special needs.

Gratuities for meals and bus driver are paid in the cost of your trip.

Checks and deposited after we know the trip will be going.

#### Refund Policy

Most of the items for a trip are paid for in advance such as: printing, mailing, tickets, meals, the bus, etc.. When these items and others have been paid for in advance and you cancel your trip after your check has been sent in there will be no refund unless you can get someone to take your place or we have a waiting list.

If cancellation is made within 7 days of the date of the trip, there will be no refund unless you can find someone to take your place or we have a waiting list, or you are in an emergency situation such as being in the hospital. Each emergency situation will be brought to the tour group committee for consideration and decision on whether you will receive a refund.
